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1. Cola 2nd Lives



It's all part of a clever effort to encourage consumers in Vietnam to recycle, and a rare success at the sort of alchemy that seeks to reincarnate garbage as advertising (even if such attempts are a cornerstone of the marketing industry). It works on the principle of evaporation. Water from the upper chambers drips down the side, and gets evaporated taking away heat from the inside, leaving the chambers cool. The top upper chamber is used to store water. A small lid made from clay is provided on top. A small faucet tap is also provided at the front lower end of chamber to tap out the water for drinking use. In the lower chamber, two shelves are provided to store the food material.

6. Portable Standing Desk



9. Sustainable Water Kettle





Chinese search giant Baidu has developed a pair of high-tech chopsticks for testing the safety of food.



The device, called Kuaisou in Chinese, is designed for detecting oils that have dangerous levels of contamination, according to The Wall Street Journal. Robin Li, CEO of Baidu, introduced the smart chopsticks at the firm's annual technology conference, where he referred to the invention in a speech on Wednesday as "a new way to sense the world."

"In the future, via Baidu Kuaisou, you'll be able to know the origin of oil and water and other foods- whether they've gone bad or what sort of nutrition they contain," he said.

15. High Protein Chips



<u>Six Foods</u> has created a brand of chips made from crickets that could make insect meat palatable for the western world. The brainchild of three Harvard graduates — Laura D'Asaro, Rose Wang and Meryl Natow — the startup's first product is Chirps, a gluten-free, natural, low fat chip. Instead of the usual potato or corn, Chirps are created from a mix of ground beans, rice and cricket powder that's baked rather than fried. The result is a bag of chips that contains 7g of protein — more than an egg. This comes from the fact that 200 calories of cricket meat provides 31g of protein, compared to 22g in beef. Additionally, it requires 1/2000th of the amount of water to farm, and 100 times less greenhouse gas is emitted.

Gluten-free and vitamin-enriched, the light ale has an alcohol volume of 5% and contains only 77 calories, additional protein to help muscle-building, antioxidants to boost the immune system and electrolytes to aid '100% bio-hydration'.

Vampt is marketing Lean Machine, which is expected to be released in summer 2014, as a recovery ale for postworkout drinking. The primary audience, according to the company, is young adults aged 19–32.

Ziferblat, the first UK branch of a Russian chain, has just opened in London (388 Old Street), where "everything is free inside except the time you spend there". The fee: 3p a minute. Ziferblat is London's first pay-per-minute cafe.

The idea is guests take an alarm clock from the cupboard on arrival and note the time, then keep it with them, before, quite literally, clocking out at the end. There's no minimum time. Guests can also get stuck into the complimentary snacks (biscuits, fruit, vegetables), or prepare their own food in the kitchen.

It then takes all of three seconds to identify the pizza of your dreams based on

which you looked at the longest. Pizza Hut says its Subconscious Menu is still in trials, but after testing to a 98 percent success rate, may one day appear in restaurants.



By looking at plants such as the lotus leaf, the Swedish firm has created a series of self-washing plates, bowls and cups. The cellulose-based surface actively repels dirt, water and grease so the need for hot soapy sinks is now obsolescent.

Created as a collaboration between Tomorrow Machine and research company Innventia following a challenge from the Swedish Forest Industries Association. The self-cleaning tableware is coloured in a blue and white marbling after being pulped and heat pressed into shape. The lightweight material won't crack or break and is coated with a super-high heated wax recently developed in Stockholm by the KTH Royal Institute of Technology, so all food scraps simply slide off.

A new app called <u>Next Glass</u> is trying to fix that, and its solution works pretty well.



39. Fabricor Stain Proof Apron



An Australian startup company is using a patented nanotechnology to create a 'hydrophobic' chef jacket and apron. Fabricor says this means dry, stain-free uniforms at the end of the day. The nanotechnology application works by modifying the fabric at a molecular level by permanently attaching hydrophobic 'whiskers' to individual fibres which elevate liquids, causing them to bead up and roll off the fabric surface. Fabricor's products are not made with spray-application like many on the market which can destroy fabrics and contain carcinogenic chemical. Its hydrophobic properties are embedded into the weave during the production of the fabric.

41. Food Waste Powered Supermarket



Proving that there's life beyond the dumpster for wasted food, a U.K. store just became the first in the country to be totally powered by leftovers. The Guardian reports that a Sainsbury's store in the West Midlands of the U.K. is set to leave the national power grid in favor of food power created through the anaerobic digestion of food scraps – via a partnership with waste recycling company Biffa.

Sainsbury's, a popular U.K. retail chain, is already the country's <u>largest user of food energy and anaerobic digestion</u> – it produces enough power to light up 2,500 homes each year. Now they have a store that will be 100 percent powered by food. Leftover food from <u>Sainsbury's supermarket in Cannock</u> gets trucked to the nearby Biffa plant where it's turned into bio-methane gas that's then used to generate electricity that's sent back to the store via a 1.5-kilometer-long transmission line.

42. Solar Cell That Cools Itself



Solar power cells need to stay relatively cool for the sake of both efficiency and longevity, but active cooling (like ventilation) isn't practical; it's expensive, and may block the very rays the cells are supposed to collect. To tackle this problem, Stanford University researchers have created a new form of solar cell that cools itself. The technique embeds a pattern of very small cone and pyramid shapes into the collector's silica surface, bouncing hot infrared wavelengths away while letting in the visible light that generates the most energy.

48. Suitcase Scooter





50. Airless Tires



Flat bicycle tires could be a thing of the past thanks to <u>BriTek</u>'s amazin Energy Return Wheel. Whereas most bike tires regulate tire firmness with air pressure, with the Energy Return Wheel one simply adjusts the tension of the rubber that is stretched around a 29-inch <u>carbon fiber</u> wheel.

Initially tested on cars, the airless tire is comprised of two layers of <u>rubber</u> – one at the center, stretched and held by adjustable rods, and the other on the outside. The space between, usually filled with air, holds a series of elastic cushions. The internal scaffolding of rods and cushions allow the tire go give and, according to Britek, react better to compression. As the internal rubber layer gets compressed by bumps from the road, the elastic potential energy stored within the wheel is returned and converted into forward momentum.

The Energy Return Wheel is still being tested (the company is considering adding thin sidewalls to the fiber rims, to keep mud and trail debris from piling up within them). Whether or not the new bike tire represents the <u>future of everyday cycling</u> remains to be seen.
